TBM Adult Campcraft Training for Fall 2022 will be held at **Huntsville State Park**, approximately six miles south of Huntsville, TX along IH-45. Campsite numbers and locations will be issued to participants upon registration.

All published rules and regulations of the State Parks Division of the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department must be observed during this event. Alcohol or illegal drug use is NOT permitted during this event. Any illegal substances will be confiscated, the authorities notified, and camper will be required to leave the grounds.

Adults are authorized to keep medication but only **for their own use**. This medication must be kept locked and secured from other persons while at camp. If participants do not have capability to lock up medications, they must be logged and kept by camp leadership.

Illness or Injury – Camper is responsible for all accidents/illnesses.

Note: All Fall Camp participants must remain at the training site, unless camp leadership permission is given to leave the training site.

Overview and Purpose

Fall Camp is a structured wilderness camp designed to increase the knowledge and skills of adults under the leadership of Christ. Fall Camp utilizes a progressive method of learning the basic, intermediate, and advanced levels of campcraft and activity skills in order to live outdoors safely and comfortably. All adults 18 years of age or older are eligible to attend. Minor aged persons may not attend the event.

Fall Camp will be made conducive to a coed camping experience as participant needs may require. All participants will strictly observe the privacy rights of their fellow camp participants.

The camp cost is \$160.00 per person with a \$60.00 discount for each person that pre-registers on or before September 17, 2022. To pre-register for Fall Camp either complete and return the application form along with Adult Release of Liability form and Medical Release form with a check to the TBM Office before September 15, or register on-line at the TBM Website on or before September 17. Pre-registration is encouraged for everyone. Each camper can download a specialized equipment list from the TBM website. Please read the following information and determine which level of training are of interest to you. Send your completed forms to TBM at 5351 Catron, Dallas, TX 75227. Be sure to indicate your campcraft training level.

Training Levels Available

Camp Units/Campcraft Training – All trainees coming to Fall Camp will be assigned to one of the following camp units for camp living and campcraft training. All campcraft trainees will sleep in tents or lean-to shelters. Reunion Camp participants (only) may sleep in tents, lean-to shelters, RVs, trailers, vehicles, local motels, basically wherever! No radios, fireworks or firearms are allowed to be displayed or utilized in camp. Each camp unit will develop its own campsite and prepare most of its own meals. All units are led by TBM Adult Campcraft Instructors. Campcraft – Outdoor Living Skills is the primary textbook and is available as a downloadable PDF for free from the TBM Website. Each unit will have supplemental materials available.

Frontiersman – introduces an adult to basic camping skills to increase their personal knowledge, abilities, and comfort level with experiences in outdoor living. Operates from one base camp for duration of event. TBM Adult Campcraft prerequisites: none

Outdoorsman – introduces an adult to intermediate camping skills to increase their personal knowledge, abilities, and comfort level with experiences in outdoor living. Uses backpacking skills to move among multiple sites. TBM Adult Campcraft prerequisites: Frontiersman.

Voyager – introduces an adult to advanced camping skills to increase their personal knowledge, abilities, and comfort level with experiences in outdoor living. Uses multiple modes of travel to move nightly among various destinations. TBM Adult Campcraft prerequisites: Outdoorsman.

Basic Instructor – introduces an adult leader to the knowledge and abilities of teaching skills to other adults in the Frontiersman level of the adult campcraft program. Includes orientation and skills demonstration. TBM Adult Campcraft prerequisites: Frontiersman.

Advanced Instructor – introduces an adult leader to the knowledge and abilities of teaching skills to other adults in the Frontiersman, Outdoorsman and Voyager levels of the adult campcraft program. Includes orientation and skills demonstration. TBM Adult Campcraft prerequisites: Voyager, Basic Instructor.

Trip Leader Assistant – introduces an adult leader to the knowledge and abilities of camping skills with an emphasis upon leading other participants safely in an extended (Voyager) trip camping experience. Candidate assists in planning and leading the experience. TBM Adult Campcraft prerequisites: Advanced Instructor.

Trip Leader – provides additional instruction to an adult leader with an emphasis upon leading other participants safely into an extended (Voyager) trip camping experience. Candidate is the primary leader on the experience and is evaluated by a TBM Trip Leader Instructor. TBM Adult Campcraft prerequisites: Trip Leader Assistant.

Reunion Camp - In addition to the above training levels, this event will offer a "Reunion Camp" for those who wish to attend for the fellowship and shared experience of this outdoor event. Some Reunion Camp leaders will help with the logistics of running a successful camp, but such assignments are not required to attend Reunion Camp. As mentioned above, sleeping accommodations for this group may vary according to individual needs – tent camping is not a requirement for this group!

Spiritual Training

Each camper is encouraged to take advantage of the opportunity to develop spiritually by engaging in both personal and corporate worship experiences and activities which direct focus upon God's Word such as daily Bible study and camp-wide campfire services. Each camp unit will also have daily devotionals and prayer time.
